Dear Student and Parent(s),

Congratulations and welcome to LVA!!! Each year that a student attends a Clark County School District school, parents must complete annual school registration. Course registration (choosing classes) is a separate process. You will receive directions regarding course registration from our Curriculum Office. The following information is provided to assist with your LVA school registration.

The first step is to log in to your Infinite Campus Portal account and complete online registration. This must be done on the parent account. It cannot be done on the student account. The Infinite Campus Portal can be accessed at <https://campus.ccsd.net/campus/portal/clark.jsp>. If you do not have your portal information, you must contact the student's current school for assistance. Do not worry if the online system lists the local zoned high school. I will be pulling our students in by hand. Once you have submitted your registration online, I will need certain documentation to complete your registration process.

- A. Proof of Residential Address. This can be a utility bill (i.e. gas, power or water) or the lease or purchase agreement. Please let me know if you cannot provide this due to an unusual living situation (living with friends/relatives etc.). I will also need proof if you have a PO Box as a mailing address.
- B. Parent identification. I will also need proof of guardianship (notarized) if applicable.

You may bring these documents to the school between the hours of 7am and 2:30pm, Monday through Friday, and I would be happy to make copies. If at all possible, please avoid coming between 10am and 11:45am as school offices tend to be very busy during the student lunch hour, and my lunch immediately follows. Alternatively, you may email the requested documents to me at lbtuggle@interact.ccsd.net, or mail them to the school, attention of the Registrar, postmarked by Wednesday, May 11, 2016.

Magnet Program Contract

This contract outlines the expectations for the performance and continuation in the Las Vegas Academy hereafter referred to as the magnet program.

ENROLLMENT STANDARDS

1. The Magnet/CTA school becomes your student's **home school** once enrolled.
2. Withdrawal from the Magnet/CTA school is **not permitted** during the school year for the remainder of the time a student is enrolled in the program. Should you wish to withdraw your child, it must be **at the end of the school year**.
3. If a **student athlete** returns to his/her zoned school or makes any other subsequent changes in enrollment, he/she would be **ineligible** for the **remainder of that school year and for 180 school days** in any sport as per NIAA (Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association). (High School only)

ACADEMIC STANDARDS

1. Students must **maintain a minimum grade point average** of a 2.0 (C average).
2. Students who earn a D or F in coursework may be placed on probation as defined by the school.
3. **While the school will work with families to ensure the academic success of each student, the student will be required to meet the expectations of the program. A student coming in academically deficient in coursework related to the program to which they applied will be asked to participate in the following which may include, but not be limited to: additional activities, tutoring, and/or additional coursework so that they may be successful in the program.**

ATTENDANCE STANDARDS

1. Students must **maintain good attendance** while attending a magnet program.
2. Students that earn **(5) or more unexcused absences** within a semester will be placed on probation.
3. Students accumulating excessive tardies will be placed on probation. (This will be based upon school site policies.)

BEHAVIOR STANDARDS

1. Students that **receive a suspension will be placed on probation.**
2. Students that are **referred for expulsion and/or are formally expelled** will be dismissed from the magnet program.
3. Students must **earn a minimum of S-satisfactory** behavior in all of their classes. Students earning an N-needs improvement or U-unsatisfactory will be placed on probation.

MAGNET PROGRAM PROBATION

Students that **violate any** of the guidelines **pertaining to academics, attendance, behavior, or any combination** of the three items will be placed on probation.

Probationary Process

- STEP 1 Students will be placed on probation if they are in **violation** of the contract.
- STEP 2 A **probation conference** will be scheduled with the parent/guardian to discuss the conditions of the probation.
- STEP 3 **Conditions of the probation.** A student may be required to partake in the following activities in order to meet the requirements of the probation which **may include but not be limited to:** summer school, online credit retrieval, after-school tutoring, community service, campus beautification, or other school-based requirement.

Students that do not meet the obligations of their probation may be dismissed from the program at the end of the school year or prior to the following school year.

REGISTRATION WORKSHEETS

The worksheets on the following pages may be used by parents/guardians and students when planning next year's class schedule; however, these worksheets are not the final form which must be completed for registration by the student, parent/guardian, and school counselor. Please follow the instructions outlined below when completing the worksheets and the final registration forms.

There is a worksheet designed for each grade level. Be certain to use the correct sheet for the grade the student will be in for the 2016-2017 school year.

1. Correctly complete the top portion of the registration form/worksheet. Use ink. PRINT LEGIBLY. If the INDEX SCORE(S) is not known, the counselor will offer assistance.
2. Fill in the "Credits earned to date" section, if known. (9th graders should attach a copy of their middle school transcripts).
3. Fill in the CLASS SELECTIONS. Make certain that grade-level requirements and prerequisites are met for each class chosen. Also, note that each grade-level worksheet/form already has the required courses a student must take preprinted on them.
4. If a student wants to petition a course, the student must complete the Petition for Course Registration Form, located in the Counseling Office. The student must discuss the Petition for Course Registration Form with the recommending teacher. The student and teacher will discuss the teacher's current recommendation and the prerequisites for the course the student wishes to petition. **The parent must understand that a student is expected to stay in the petitioned class the entire school year.** A schedule change will not be made for students in a petitioned class until the school year is completed.
5. Selecting ALTERNATES is critical. Be certain to list alternate classes. A chart of courses which offer elective credit has been provided (located after registration sheets). Use this chart as a quick reference to determine the prerequisites and grade requirements for each course. Be certain to read the entire course description written in the COURSE OFFERINGS section of this guide before signing up for a class or an alternate.)
6. Teacher recommendations and signatures are required for the classes listed on the worksheet/forms.
7. **Courses that students select this spring are the courses they will be required to attend next year.**
8. Make certain to **read and understand the Schedule Change Policy.**
9. Not all courses listed in this catalog/guide will necessarily be offered next fall. The school Master Schedule is derived from the classes students sign up for this spring and from staffing allocations from the Clark County School District. **Due to increased/decreased enrollment, staff changes, and/or low pre-registration numbers, the administration may have to balance, drop, or add course selections during any academic year.**
10. We advise that both the student and the parent/guardian sign the final registration form.
