

If accepted, all incoming freshman are placed in foundation level courses. Upper classmen will be placed in courses according to the skill level demonstrated in their portfolio.



To audition for the Las Vegas Academy, visit the Clark County School District's Magnet School Application website: magnet.ccsd.net/


Upcoming audition dates: JANUARY 29th AND FEBRUARY 5th.





AUDITION PROCESS OVERVIEW

- 1. IF PERMITTED BY CCSD: In person audition procedures (pages 8-15).
- 2. You must complete the CCSD Magnet online application and select your Visual Arts major. Apply now. magnet.ccsd.net/
- 3. Report to the Visual Arts Building room VA101, 15 minutes before your scheduled audition time. Check in with the secretary and receive your audition paperwork. Students must submit their portfolio and written response. Submissions will be reviewed during the audition and then returned at the end of the session (See portfolio requirements p. 8, 9).
- 4. Students will be called into the appropriate rooms for their specified major. Parents may wait in room VA101 or outdoors. Restrooms are available. Auditions take approximately 2 hours.
- 5. Students will be dismissed with all original materials and artwork they arrived with.
- 6. Notification emails will be sent by the Magnet Office first week of March.

PORTFOLIO REQUIREMENTS

Graphic Design Sculpture Visual Design

A portfolio submission and a skills demonstration are required for majors listed above.

PORTFOLIO PART 1

The Portfolio submission must include art work with the specific imagery and use of media listed below:

- I. Your hand holding an object, drawn in charcoal
- II. Self-Portrait using graphite pencil: draw yourself by looking into a mirror (no photo reference)
- III. Contour Line drawing of your shoe using ballpoint pen
- IV. Colored Landscape Painting using watercolor, acrylic, or oil paint

PHOTOGRAPHY PORTFOLIO PART 1

4 Required Photographs:

- I. Landscape urban or rural, night or day, demonstrate a vast depth of field.
- II. Still-life / Representational Self Portrait arrange to represent your interests and personality
- III. Sequence/series of 4 to 6 frames show a series of the same object or person completing an action.
- IV. Actual Self Portrait use appropriate lighting, dress, pose for a clear accurate photographic portrait.

Prior to your audition, label all portfolio entries with your MAGNET # and STUDENT NAME on the back of each artwork



DO NOT INCLUDE IN PORTFOLIO:

- Copyright Characters or Cartoons
- Anime Styled Works
- Large Sculptures
- Wet Artwork
- Photocopies of Artwork (unless large sculptures or murals)

PORTFOLIO PART 2

(submit work specific to the major you're applying to)

A. GRAPHIC DESIGN: 3-5 redesigns of major brand logos, typography practices of hand lettering, advertising or packaging design, magazine or poster design. All pieces must be original without copyright infringement.

*Works may be submitted as 8.5"x11" high resolution prints or as PNG/JPG files on a USB flash drive

B. PHOTOGRAPHY:

Additional 3 to 5 photographs: Specific to the 'Photographic Elements & Principles of Design' Examples: PATTERN, SYMMETRY, TEXTURE, DEPTH OF FIELD (SHALLOW), LINES.

- C. SCULPTURE: 3 TO 5 -3D pieces such as ceramics, wire, wood, plaster, jewelry, glass.
- D. VISUAL DESIGN: 3 to 5 drawings and/or paintings created by observing people, places and things.

Film/Video Production (only)

FILM/VIDEO applicants must create and submit a presentation for a short film/video. Include a script, a storyboard (series of panel drawings), and a brief one page essay detailing your specific interest in film and video production. Please organize and submit your work in an expanding file/folder or portfolio. INCLUDE YOUR MAGNET # ON EACH PORTFOLIO PIECE.

FILM & VIDEO MAJOR



IN PERSON AUDITION PROCESS

Students will be escorted from the Visual Arts building to Frazier Film rooms where they will create a short treatment (short story). A prompt will be provided during the audition. All materials will be provided.

The applicant must present the following:

- 1. Create a presentation for a short film/video that includes:
 - **Script** A 2-3 page script that includes time, place, character dialogue and most importantly a beginning, middle and end to the story.
 - Storyboard Storyboards that break down your story into a moment by moment series of panels drawings, like a comic book. Storyboards should include variety in framing: close-ups, mid-shots, wide shots – your variety in framing is important, how well you render will not be graded. Detailed stick figure drawings are welcome.
- 2. Essay In addition, you must submit a one-page essay detailing your specific interest in film and video production and what you want to accomplish as a Film & Video Production student at LVA.
- **3. Skills demonstration test** All students will be required to create a short treatment (short story) during the skills demonstration test, a prompt will be provided during the audition. All materials will be provided.

GRAPHIC DESIGN MAJOR



IN PERSON AUDITION PROCESS

Students should arrive fifteen minutes early to check-in. Please bring required portfolio pieces from p. 8. Students will be escorted in small groups to the design room where they lay their portfolio and audition numbers out for scoring. All portfolios will be returned at the end of the audition.

Students will receive a "brief" from a company describing their goals and message. For the skill demonstration, students must draw thumbnails of different logo ideas, design a final logo based on specific boundaries and apply the requirements of a deliverable for the company (ex. poster, packaging, advertising) showing consistency of color, shape, and choice of typography. Neatness, craftsmanship and originality are important in the work process.

Upon completion of the skill demonstration, students turn in all work which will remain with staff for scoring. Students return to the check-in room with their portfolios and are dismissed to their parents.

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS

Students interested in Graphic Design must bring a portfolio as described on P. 8 that includes traditional media and pieces that show graphic design concepts, such as logos, posters, T-Shirt design, etc. All pieces must be original without copyright infringement.

NO DEVICES WILL BE VIEWED FOR WORK, ALL DIGITAL FILES MUST BE ON A FLASH DRIVE

PHOTOGRAPHY MAJOR

IN PERSON AUDITION PROCESS

The audition process for Photography applicants includes a portfolio submission and a skills demonstration session. The portfolio requirements are listed p. 8, 9.

SKILLS DEMONSTRATION SESSION

30-minute test (using the camera on your phone)

Choose 3 objects provided to you at LVA.

Using the LVA campus as your background, photograph the 3 objects.

Directions:

Create 3 photographs that address lighting and the photographic elements and principles of design (PATTERN, SYMMETRY, TEXTURE, DEPTH OF FIELD (SHALLOW), LINES.)

- 1. Demonstrate dynamic backgrounds and the developed lighting.
- 2. Submit 3 images by emailing them to anderdy@nv.ccsd.net
- 3. Students must email all 3 images during their scheduled audition time.
- 4. Email must be sent directly from the camera/phone, no editing permitted.













SCULPTURE MAJOR

IN PERSON AUDITION PROCESS

- Students will be escorted in small groups to the portfolio room where they lay out their works with their audition numbers visible.
 Staff will evaluate portfolios while students complete the skill demonstration portion of the audition.
 All portfolios will be returned at the end of audition. See p. 8 & 9 for portfolio requirements.
- 2. Students will be escorted to the drawing room where a still life and drawing materials will be provided. Students have 30 minutes in which to draw a still life arrangement (see Skills Demonstration p. 14).
- 3. Upon completion of the skills demonstration portion, students return to the portfolio room to gather their work and are dismissed to their parents.




- 1. Students will be escorted in small groups to the portfolio room where they lay out their works with their magnet numbers visible.

 Staff will evaluate portfolios while students complete the skills demonstration portion of the audition. All portfolios will be returned at the end of audition.

- 2. Students will be escorted to the drawing room where a still life and drawing materials will be provided. Students have 30 minutes in which to draw a still life arrangement.

- 3. Upon completion of the skills demonstration portion, students return to the portfolio room to gather their work and are dismissed to their parents.




